Dr. Amir Hamrahian received his medical degree from Hacettepe University in Ankara, Turkey, did his internal medicine residency at the University of North Dakota and completed his Endocrinology fellowship at Case Western Reserve University.

Dr. Hamrahian joined the Cleveland Clinic in 2000 and was the director of the fellowship program before joining the Cleveland Clinic Abu Dhabi as the chief of the Department of Endocrinology for four years. He joined Johns Hopkins University as an Associate Professor of Medicine in 2018. He currently serves as the medical director of the adrenal center at Johns Hopkins University.
